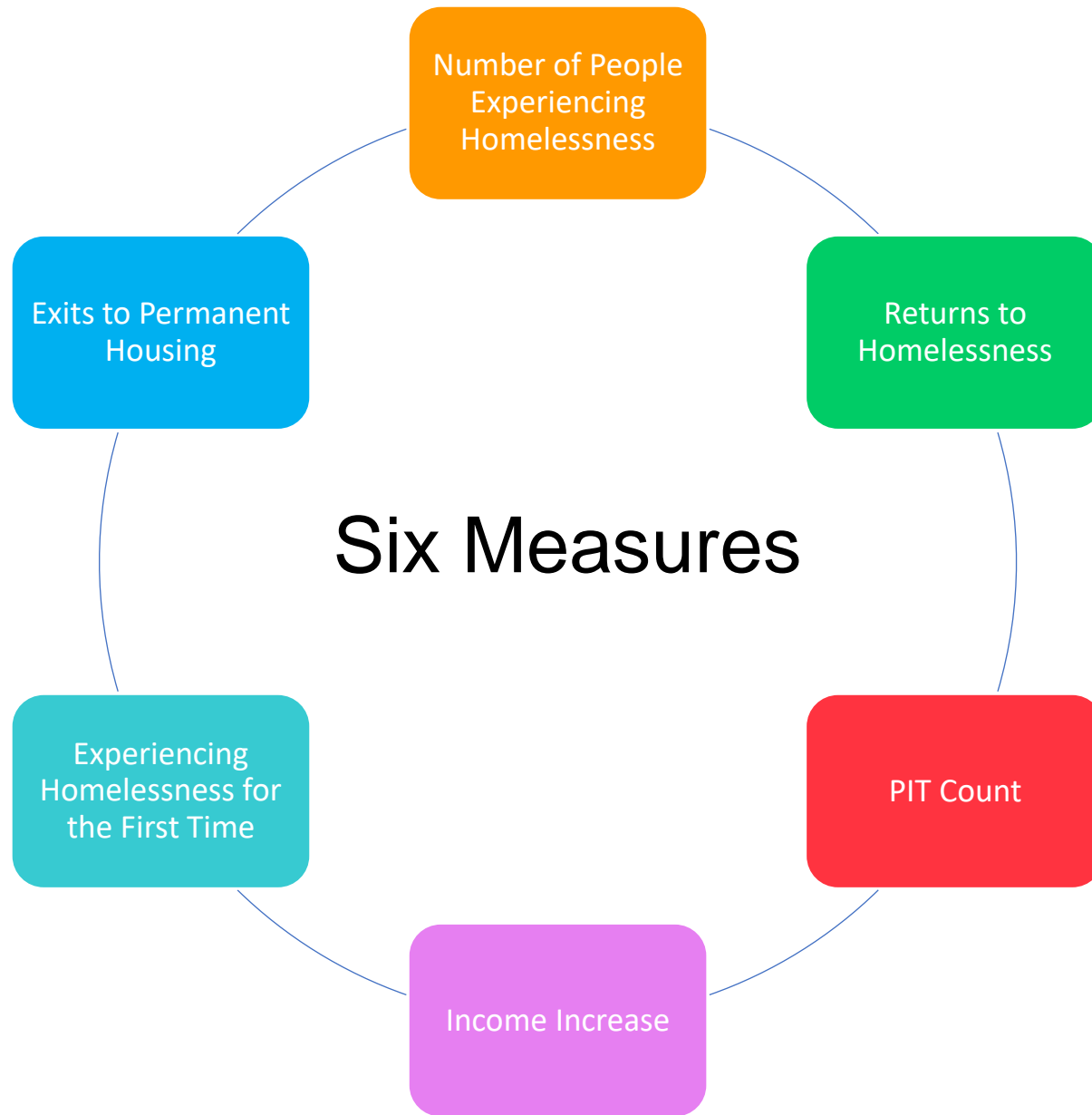


# 2022 Placer County System Performance Measures (SPM)

ES – Emergency Shelter, LOT – Length of Time, PH – Permanent Supportive Housing,  
RRH – Rapid Re-housing, SO – Street Outreach, TH – Transitional Housing



The System Performance Measures help CoCs gauge their progress in preventing and ending homelessness. Each CoC is expected to use these measures to evaluate how well their homeless systems are functioning and where improvements are necessary.

HUD compares communities to themselves annually and uses the SPM as a factor for future NOFAs.

The data is pulled directly from HMIS and the reporting period is October 1 – September 30.

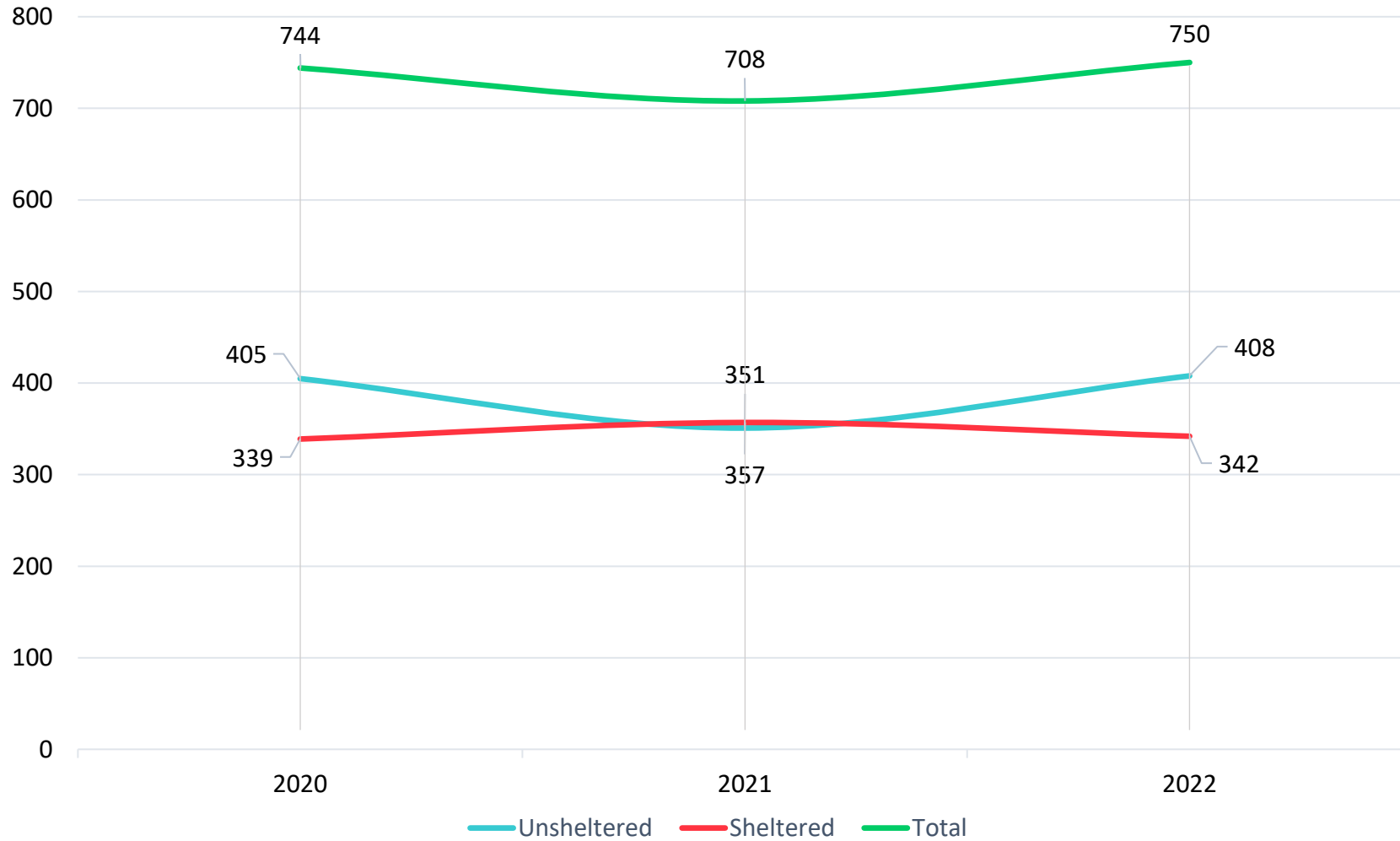
