

2023 Point-in-Time Count



492 Individuals Experiencing Homelessness

On January 25, 2023, a minimum of 492 individuals were experiencing homelessness in Nevada County. Of those experiencing homelessness, 227 were unsheltered.

By comparison, the 2022 count surveyed a minimum of 527 individuals experiencing homelessness in Nevada County.

What is the Point-in-Time Count?

A Point-in-Time (PIT) count is a one-night estimate of both sheltered and unsheltered homeless populations. The PIT count provides the number and demographic characteristics of persons who are homeless on the night of the count, both sheltered in emergency shelter or transitional housing; or unsheltered, on the street or in some other place unfit for human habitation, on the night of the count.


212 individuals selfreported experiencing substance use disorder. Mental Health Disability



209 individuals selfreported living with a mental health disability. Physical Disability




154 individuals selfreported living with a physical disability.




Race and Ethnicity

The number of individuals who identify as Black, African American, and African represent 4% of total people experiencing homelessness despite accounting for 1% of all people living in poverty in Nevada County (1).
