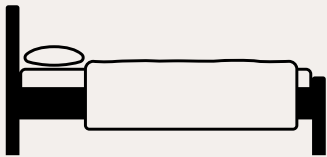

2022 Homeless System Performance

The homeless response system in Placer County served **1711 Peple** and **1251 Households** experienced homelessness from 10/1/2021 - 9/30/2022



People experiencing homelessness spent an average of **193 days homeless**

24% of all people served **exited** homelessness to a **permanent housing destination**

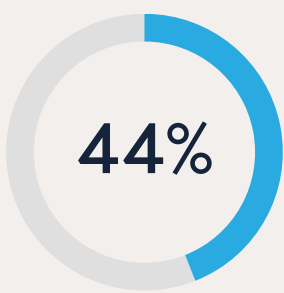


What is the Homeless Response System in Placer County?

The homeless response system is the network of providers collaborating to quickly and efficiently move people and households out of homelessness and into housing. These providers includes nonprofit organizations, housing authorities, local and federal government agencies, faith-based organizations, the VA, shelter providers, and other homeless coalitions.

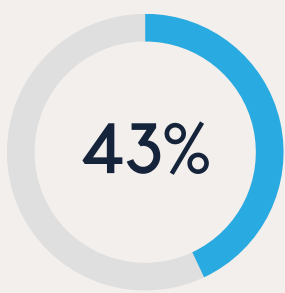


First Time Homeless



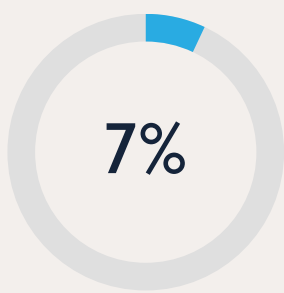
547 households experienced homelessness for the first time

Continuously Homeless



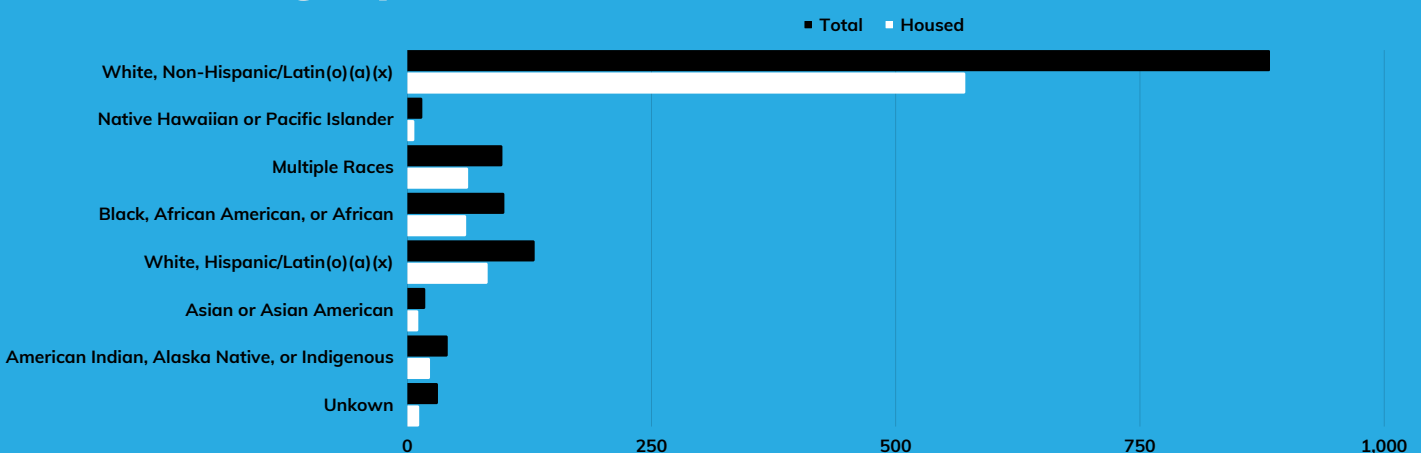
539 households remained homeless from the previous reporting period
